1. Purpose

The purpose of this report is to seek the approval of the Corporate Governance Committee (the Committee) for the Head of Internal Audit Service Annual Report (the Annual Report) 2015-16.

2. Recommendations

The Committee is asked to approve the Annual Report.

3. Executive Summary

- 3.1 A common set of Public Sector Internal Audit Standards (PSIAS) exist. The objectives of the PSIAS were reported to the CFA at its meeting on 24 September 2015.
- 3.2 The PSIAS apply to all internal audit service providers. The internal audit activity for the CFA is currently outsourced to Leicestershire County Council's Internal Audit Service led by the Head of Internal Audit Service (HoIAS).
- 3.3 The PSIAS require the HoIAS to provide an annual report to 'the Board' timed to support the annual governance statement (the AGS). The annual report must include:
 - a) an opinion on the overall adequacy and effectiveness of the CFA's control environment
 - b) a summary of the audit work from which the opinion is derived
 - c) a comparison of work actually undertaken with work that was planned including a summary of the performance of the internal audit function
 - d) a statement on conformance with the PSIAS and the results of the internal audit Quality Assurance and Improvement Programme (QAIP)
 - e) any issues the HolAS judges relevant to the preparation of the AGS

- 3.4 At its meeting on 24 September 2015, the CFA approved the Internal Audit Charter which interprets the Corporate Governance Committee (the Committee) as 'the Board'. The Committee will have responsibility for monitoring the adequacy and effectiveness of the internal audit function, including receiving the HoIAS' annual report.
- 3.5 The annual report contains the HolAS' annual opinion (the opinion) on the overall adequacy and effectiveness of the CFA's control environment. The opinion forms part of the annual review of the effectiveness of the CFA's governance framework undertaken when compiling the AGS. The HolAS chooses to show sub-opinions for the three components of 'the control environment' (the framework of governance; risk management; and internal control).

4. Report Detail

The Head of Internal Audit Service Annual Report 2015-16

- 4.1 The Head of Internal Audit Service Annual Report 2015-16 is included as the **Appendix.**
- 4.2 Detail behind how the sub-opinions were formed is found in **Annex 1**. Based on an objective assessment of the results of individual audits undertaken, actions by management thereafter, and the professional judgement of the HolAS in evaluating other related activities, overall reasonable assurance was given over the adequacy and effectiveness of the CFA control environment.
 - Nevertheless, a separate isolated issue will be considered by the full CFA once the report has been issued as final.
- 4.3 A list of the audit work from which the sub-opinions are derived containing the scope, recommendations and individual assignment opinions is found in **Annex 2**. Most assignments were 'assurance type' defined as 'an objective examination of evidence for the purpose of providing an independent assessment'. Overall assurance ratings were positive.
- 4.4 Over 80% of original planned and unplanned work was completed (final report issued). Additional time was incurred to conduct the unplanned audit and in additional client management (new governance and management arrangements). The variations were agreed as being necessary with the Treasurer beforehand. The final charge to the CFA was £25,650 (£2,700 above budget).
- 4.5 The HolAS' most recent self-assessment (conducted in May 2016) identified that current practices generally sufficiently conform to the PSIAS. However, a few specific areas have been identified where action is needed before the HolAS can claim to fully conform, and state so in documents and correspondence.

There are no direct financial implications arising from this report. However, as a result of the work carried out, assurance regarding the operation of key financial systems is gained and there would be an expectation that implementing internal audit recommendations could improve effectiveness, efficiency and economy.

The internal audit function provides reassurance that effective governance, risk management and internal control procedures are in place. Internal audit reports are used to inform the Treasurer and the Chief Fire and Rescue Officer of the detailed findings of the audit and highlight actions that are required to safeguard the CFA's interests.
