Facts and Stats

- 18% of all crashes involve a driver aged 17-24
- 22% of fatalities in 2011 involved drivers aged 17-24
- 48,983 drivers banned in their probationary period, in the four years to 2013
- In the 17-24 age category, men are 4 times more likely to have points on their licence for driving uninsured than women
- 24% of drivers have nodded off while driving
- One in five road deaths is a motorcyclist
- The number of people who die each week on UK roads is 40
- The number of people who are seriously injured each day on UK roads is 60
- Men are twice as likely to crash as women
- Rural roads are the scene of most road deaths
- Under-25 males are ten times more likely to be killed or seriously injured in a car crash, than those aged 35 or over
- Virtually all (95%) road accidents involve some human error
